

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## IN AND AROUND THE CLASSROOM Question Web



Comprehending a text is the most important reason for reading. One of the strategies we are teaching our students, in order to help with their comprehension, is a technique called "Question Web". The focus is on asking and answering "thin" (literal) and 'thick' (inferential) questions. The students record a question they would like answered from the text in the middle of the page. The student then reads aloud a few pages from the book. As information that pertains to the question comes up, they record the information in their books and draw a line connecting it to the circled question. They can

then use the information gathered to answer their question.

#### **NECOM PIANO TRIO VISIT**

Our school will host the NECOM Piano Trio again this year on Friday 21 July. We are so fortunate to be so close to the New England Conservatorium of Music to be able to take advantage of these opportunities for our students to experience a concert of live music performed by professional musicians at very little cost.
