SUMMER SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Boys Summer Uniform:

Black shoes with grey ankle socks Grey shorts - Rugger's / Stubbies design Pale green hand out short-sleeved shirt with bottle green school crest on left pocket Girls Summer Uniform:

- Black shoes with white ankle socks
- Skorts for all girls K-6 in the new check (special makes are available)
- Hang out white short-sleeved shirts with bottle green School crest on left pocket.

If you require a new Girl Skorts, it is recommended to contact InterSports and order in advance as they might not have all sizes available in store.

We ask parents to ensure that all children present themselves at school in their correct uniform. The school's official uniform supplier is InterSports Armidale located at 151 Rusden Street, Armidale. Phone 6771 2344. The school stocks the school hats and ties as a service to our families as these items are frequently lost.

GREEN SCHOOL HAT (Available from school for \$10.50) HAT MUST BE WORN BY ALL STUDENTS ALL YEAR ROUND. Such hats are compulsory in all NSW Primary Schools as is the school's 'no hat, no play' policy. Both are strictly enforced.

*Jewellery: Watch, studs, small sleepers acceptable.

*Hair: 'Colouring of hair' is not to occur during the school term.

*Wearing of make-up and nail polish is unacceptable during school hours.

Students wear summer uniforms in Terms 1 and 4 and winter uniform in Terms 2 and 3 (Parents are to use their discretion during abnormal weather fluctuations).

ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING ARE TO BE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH THE CHILD'S NAME

If a student is out of uniform for any reason a note must be sent to the Principal. This is a short term solution and all efforts need to be made to ensure the correct uniform is worn at all times.

HOW TO HAVE AN EFFECTIVE CONVERSATION WITH YOUR CHILD





Do these images show effective conversation?

Time, place and body language can give a message of 'I'm genuinely interested in what you are telling me' or 'I don't really have the time for this'. Most importantly be present to and have time for your child. The holidays are a great opportunity for this.

When asking your child about their school day a typical conversations may look like this:

Parent: What did you do at school today?

Child: Nothing!

Using the following 5 questions, suggested by Lyn Sharratt (internationally acclaimed education consultant from Toronto, Canada) for parents to ask their children, can encourage your child to provide you with effective feedback and open up a conversation:

1. What did you learn today?

2. How did you go/do?

3. What did you do if you didn't understand?

- 4. How can you improve on your learning?
- 5. What are you most proud of?

COMMUNITY NEWS

The Aboriginal Culture Centre and Keeping Place (ACCKP) is once again running a Holiday Program for primary school children from Monday 8th October to Friday 12th October. The program will run from 9am to 12noon. This program is open to all children of primary school age. The theme for the October Holiday Program is "**Prepare for Christmas**". Children will have the opportunity to learn and carry out activities surrounding this theme.

The cost for the morning tea, supervision, materials and activities will be covered by the ACCKP. This holiday program is being funded by the Department of Education. Please pick up and complete a registration form from the ACCKP by the 1st October 2018 to ensure your child/children's place is confirmed.

Holiday Activities - Martin Levins (Digital Technologies)

Martin Levins will be holding 2 workshops at the Armidale Library on Tuesday 9th October.

Session 1 (1hr) - Younger Kids (ages 7 and under) using Scratch Junior as a story telling environment. "Scratch" is a computer programming environment developed by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Lifelong Kindergarten Group.

In this session, we'll use Scratch Junior on Library-supplied iPads where participants will learn how to make animated stories: a skill that they can use at home on their own iPad or tablet. No previous experience is expected or assumed. Session 2 (3hrs) - Will focus on Physical computing (ages 8 and up). This means building interactive physical systems by the use of software and hardware that can sense and respond to the world.

In this session, participants will learn how to use a micro-controller to respond to our environment and work towards building a system that will automatically measure water demand in a garden. It will water gardens only when they need it to conserve our precious water resources. Participants can us Library-supplied laptops or bring their own laptop (iPads, Tablets and other devices will not be supported in this session).

If you bring your own device, make sure it's a charged laptop with Wi-Fi and a working USB socket.
