PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Catholic Schools Week

This year Catholic Schools Week will be held this term in Week 5. The theme for this year's Catholic Schools Week is 'Pray with Hope'. This theme resonates with the vision of our Catholic schools to be a Christ-centred inclusive learning community that supports young people to realise a hope-filled future. We will be taking the whole school to Armidale to attend the celebration Mass in the De La Salle Chapel at O'Connor Catholic on Thursday 30 May. We are in the process of organising another worthwhile activity for the students while we are in Armidale to maximise the use of the bus which will be provided free of charge to our families through the CSO. We will notify you of these plans once they have been confirmed.

Flexible Learning Space

During the holidays we had the dividing wall removed in the Year 3-6 classroom. This has now created a flexible learning space to allow the students to move around the classroom and work with either teacher or aide in groups or individually as needed.

By having two teachers working within our classroom spaces it enables us to create inclusive classrooms where all learners have access to the expertise of both teachers. Teachers collaboratively work together to co-create learning experiences for each individual student allowing targeted teaching for each student as their needs arise.

Co-teaching allows for peer collaboration and discussion resulting in students learning more than twice what they would learn in a traditional classroom with a traditional teacher. Even more than differentiation and immediate feedback. (Education expert, John Hattie 5 Nov 2017)

Open Morning



IN AND AROUND THE CLASSROOM



We have borrowed a memorial box from the Australian War Memorial for the students to explore. This Memorial Box explores the Australian experience of the First World War. It includes objects that show the Anzac experience, and the involvement of over 416,000 Australian soldiers, sailors, airmen, and nurses – as well as those on the home front – during a defining period of our nation's history. Their stories come to life as we unpack the real and replica First World War items in this box.

This memorial box also supports our students to explore the idea that the cultural, historical and social contexts surrounding WW1 affected the point of view from which texts were written and how they were read. These contexts have changed over time, influencing how modern readers interpret past WW1 texts and how modern writers represent the experience of war.
